In light of the COVID-19 pandemic and the commitment to keeping students and speakers safe, the Jewish Federation of Greater Indianapolis (JFGI) will only be offering virtual presentations for the 2020-21 school year.



Holocaust Speakers Bureau

Members of the JFGI Speakers Bureau tell the personal stories of their families' experiences during the Holocaust. This allows students to understand that the Holocaust is not a stagnant point in history, with the faces of the unknown staring at them from a textbook. The Holocaust is, in fact, an event that touched the lives of those living in their community and continues to reverberate through the generations. There is a virtual live or pre-recorded presentation option with an additional optional live Q&A session to supplement the pre-recorded.

ADL Workshop

JCRC staff has been trained by the Anti-Defamation League to facilitate their successful Words to Action: Empowering Students to Address Antisemitism. This program is an interactive education program for middle, high school and college students designed to empower and equip them with constructive and effective responses to combat antisemitism and anti-Israel bias, including:

- Stereotypes and prejudice
- Vandalism
- Harassment
- Hate speech
- Anti-Israel incidents
